Share a recipe

Comfort food for the rainy season, try this local favorite!

BEEF CURRY STEW

Ingredients: 2 TBSP butter or margarine, 2.5 lbs stew meat, 1 clove garlic minced, 2 tsp. salt, 1/4 tsp. pepper, 2.5 quarts water, 3 stalks celery, 2 carrots & 2 potatoes, pared, 1 onion, cut into wedges, 1.5 TBSP curry powder, 1/2 cup flour, 1 cup water.

Instructions: In a large saucepan, melt butter and brown meat. Add garlic, salt and pepper. Add the 2.5 quarts water; cover & simmer for 2 hours or until meat is tender. Cut celery & potatoes into 1.5 inch pieces. Add veggies and curry powder to stew; cover & simmer for 20-30 min. Mix flour with the 1 cup water and slowly stir into the stew; Cook, stirring constantly, until mixture thickens. Makes 8 servings.

Staying Safe during Rainy Season



Rainy season is upon us once again and while we appreciate the rain and what it can do, listed are a few precautions that can be taken to ensure safety.
