What to do When a Storm Approaches

When a Hurricane Watch is declared, make final preparations and review emergency plans with your family. Listed below are a few reminders when a storm approaches;

1. Listen to your radio or TV for instructions.
2. Stay indoors during high winds. Do not go "sightseeing" during or immediately after a storm.
3. Make whatever telephone calls you need to make, but limit those calls to less than a minute if possible. This is to avoid telephone gridlock and keep lines open for emergency calls.
4. Know the warning signals and where shelters are located.
5. Have your home survival kit ready.
6. Bring all potted plants into the house.
7. Remove and store lanai furniture or any loose objects.
8. Unplug electrical appliances you may not need or use.
9. Wedge sliding glass doors at the top or a dowel or piece of broom handle into the track of sliding glass doors to prevent them from coming loose when the wind blows. In next month's issue we will include a list of emergency supplies that are needed.

Registering your Pet
